Notice to Owner(s) for a Home Constructed on or after January 1, 1978

The use of lead paint was discontinued in all building construction conducted on or after January 1, 1978. If your home was built on or after January 1, 1978, the proposed remodeling activities specified in your Remodeling Contract are not subject to the EPA lead paint renovation rules and requirements.

Notice to Owner(s) for a Home Constructed before January 1, 1978 – Receipt of Pamphlet

If your home was built before 1978, Federal law requires that you must receive a copy of the pamphlet "Renovate Right: Important Lead Hazard Information for Families, Child Care Providers and Schools" from the Contractor before undertaking renovation activities that disturb six square feet or more of painted surfaces in a room for interior projects, or more than twenty square feet of painted surfaces for exterior projects. The pamphlet contains important information on the potential risk of lead hazard exposure from renovation activity.

Contracting firms that are paid to perform renovations in pre-1978 homes that will disturb painted surfaces as described above must be certified either by the Environmental Protection Agency, a delegated state agency, or a delegated native-American tribal authority, as may be applicable, to conduct lead-based paint renovations, repairs, or painting activities.

For jobs that will disturb lead paint in pre-1978 homes as described above, contracting firms must assign certified renovators. In order to become certified renovators, individuals must take training from an EPA-accredited training provider.
