Title: Support for American Technology Original Sponsor: Standing Committee on Research

WHEREAS, the viability and health of the United States economy are in significant measure dependent on the ability of domestic industry to compete successfully with foreign manufacturers;

WHEREAS, foreign building products are successfully penetrating American markets and displacing domestic business;

WHEREAS, many nations, particularly in Europe and Japan, understand the importance of supporting their industries financially and otherwise in order to gain a competitive edge;

WHEREAS, the risks of introducing new technologies in the residential industry are particularly great given the cyclical nature of the market, the long lead times required to develop and test new products, and the significant regulatory hurdles to pass;

WHEREAS, as a result, investment in new and improved building technologies by American industry is not adequate relative to a need, particularly in light of current economic conditions and the investment and/or support by the federal government is practically non-existent; and

WHEREAS, improvements in building technology can invigorate the domestic building industry and improve the quality of life for families of all incomes,
