1	AN ACT relating to the dual credit scholarship program, making an appropriation
2	therefor, and declaring an emergency.
3	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	→ SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS 164.740 TO 164.7891 IS CREATED
5	TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
6	(1) For purposes of this section:
7	(a) "Academic term" means the fall or spring academic semester;
8	(b) "Academic year" means July 1 through June 30 of each year;
9	(c) "Approved dual credit course" means a dual credit course developed in
10	accordance with KRS 164.098 and shall include general education courses
11	and career and technical education courses within a career pathway
12	approved by the Kentucky Department of Education that leads to an
13	industry-recognized credential;
14	(d) "Authority" means the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority;
15	(e) ''Dual credit'' has the same meaning as in KRS 158.007;
16	(f) "Dual credit tuition rate ceiling" means one-third (1/3) of the per credit
17	hour tuition amount charged by the Kentucky Community and Technical
18	College System for in-state students;
19	(g) ''Eligible high school student'' means a student who:
20	1. Is a Kentucky resident;
21	2. Is enrolled in a Kentucky high school as a senior or junior;
22	3. Has completed a thirty (30) minute college success counseling session;
23	<u>and</u>
24	4. Is enrolled, or accepted for enrollment, in an approved dual credit
25	course at a participating institution;
26	(h) "Participating institution" means a postsecondary institution that:
27	1. Has an agreement with the authority for the administration of the

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1	<u>Dual Credit Scholarship Program;</u>
2	2. Charges no more than the dual credit tuition rate ceiling per credit
3	hour, including any additional fees, for any dual credit course it offers
4	to any Kentucky public or nonpublic high school student;
5	3. Does not charge any tuition or fees to an eligible high school student
6	for an approved dual credit course beyond what is paid by the Dual
7	Credit Scholarship Program when the course is not successfully
8	completed; and
9	<u>4. Is a:</u>
10	a. Kentucky Community and Technical College System institution;
11	b. Four (4) year Kentucky public college or university; or
12	c. Four (4) year private college or university that is accredited by
13	the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and whose
14	main campus is located in Kentucky; and
15	(i) "Successfully completed" means a student receiving both secondary and
16	postsecondary credit upon completion of an approved dual credit course.
17	(2) To promote dual credit coursework opportunities at no cost to eligible Kentucky
18	high school students, the General Assembly hereby establishes the Dual Credit
19	Scholarship Program.
20	(3) In consultation with the Education and Workforce Development Cabinet, the
21	authority shall administer the Dual Credit Scholarship Program and shall
22	promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A as
23	may be needed for the administration of the program.
24	(4) (a) Each high school shall apply to the authority for dual credit scholarship
25	funds for each eligible high school student.
26	(b) The authority may award a dual credit scholarship to an eligible high
27	school student for an academic term to the extent funds are available for

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1	that purpose, except that a scholarship shall be awarded to an eligible high
2	school senior prior to awarding an eligible high school junior.
3	(c) An eligible high school student may receive a dual credit scholarship for a
4	maximum of two (2) successfully completed dual credit courses.
5	(d) The dual credit scholarship award amount shall be equal to the amount
6	charged by a participating institution, not to exceed the dual credit tuition
7	rate ceiling for each dual credit hour, except the scholarship amount shall
8	be reduced by fifty percent (50%) if the dual credit course is not successfull
9	completed by the student.
10	(e) Dual credit scholarship funds shall not be used for remedial o
11	developmental coursework.
12	(5) Each participating institution shall submit information each academic term to
13	the authority required for the administration of the scholarship as determined b
14	the authority.
15	(6) Beginning August 1, 2017, and each year thereafter, the authority shall provide of
16	report to the secretary of the Education and Workforce Development Cabinet, the
17	president of the Council on Postsecondary Education, and the commissioner of
18	the Kentucky Department of Education to include:
19	(a) The number of students, by local school district and in total, served by the
20	Dual Credit Scholarship Program; and
21	(b) The number of dual credits earned by students by high school and in total.
22	(7) By May 31, 2019, and each year thereafter, the Kentucky Center for Education
23	and Workforce Statistics, in collaboration with the authority, shall publish date
24	on the Dual Credit Scholarship Program's academic and workforce outcomes
25	The center shall annually provide a report on the data to the Interim Join
26	Committee on Education.
27	(8) (a) The Dual Credit Scholarship Program trust fund is hereby created as a trus

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1		fund in the State Treasury to be administered by the Kentucky Higher
2		Education Assistance Authority for the purpose of providing scholarships
3		described in this section.
4	<u>(b)</u>	The trust fund shall consist of state general fund appropriations, gifts and
5		grants from public and private sources, and federal funds. All moneys
6		included in the fund shall be appropriated for the purposes set forth in this
7		section.
8	<u>(c)</u>	Any unalloted or unencumbered balances in the trust fund shall be invested
9		as provided in KRS 42.500(9). Income earned from the investments shall be
10		credited to the trust fund.
11	<u>(d)</u>	Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, any fund balance at the close of the fiscal
12		year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward to the next fiscal year and
13		continuously appropriated only for the purposes specified in this section.

17	<u>(a)</u>	"Academic year" means July 1 through June 30 of each year;

19	<u>(c)</u>	"Eligible student" means an eligible high school student who has
20		graduated from high school or a student eligible under KRS 164.7879(3)(e);
21	<u>(d)</u>	"Registered apprenticeship program" means an apprenticeship program
22		that:
23		1. Is established in accordance with the requirements of KRS Chapter
24		<u>343;</u>
25		2. Requires a minimum of two thousand (2,000) hours of on-the-job
26		work experience;
27		3. Requires a minimum of one hundred forty-four (144) hours of related

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I		instruction for each year of the apprenticeship; and
2		4. Is approved by the Kentucky Labor Cabinet;
3		(e) "Related instruction" has the same meaning as in KRS 343.010; and
4		(f) "Sponsor" has the same meaning as in KRS 343.010.
5	<u>(2)</u>	Notwithstanding KRS 164.7881, an eligible student who earned a KEES award
6		and is an apprentice in a registered apprenticeship program shall be eligible for a
7		Kentucky educational excellence scholarship.
8	<u>(3)</u>	(a) Beginning with the 2018-2019 academic year, an eligible student enrolled
9		in a registered apprenticeship program may receive reimbursement of
10		tuition, books, required tools, and other approved expenses required for
11		participation in the registered apprenticeship program, upon certification by
12		the sponsor and approval by the authority.
13		(b) The reimbursement amount an eligible student may receive in an academic
14		year shall not exceed the student's KEES award maximum.
15		(c) The total reimbursement amount an eligible student may receive under this
16		section shall not exceed the student's KEES award maximum multiplied by
17		<u>four (4).</u>
18	<u>(4)</u>	Eligibility for a KEES scholarship under this section shall terminate upon the
19		earlier of:
20		(a) The expiration of five (5) years following the eligible student's graduation
21		from high school or receiving a GED, except as provided in KRS
22		<u>164.7881(5); or</u>
23		(b) The eligible student's successful completion of the registered apprenticeship
24		program.
25	<u>(5)</u>	The authority shall promulgate administrative regulations establishing the
26		procedures for making awards under this section in consultation with the
27		Kentucky Labor Cabinet, the Kentucky Education and Workforce Development

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1 <u>Cabinet, and the Kentucky Economic Development Cabinet.</u>

- 2 → Section 3. Whereas the timely implementation of the scholarship provisions
- 3 created in this Act are needed to provide immediate financial assistance to Kentucky
- 4 students, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its passage and
- 5 approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law.

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
