The NAHB Student Chapters **Residential Construction Management Competition (RCMC)** is a highlight of the annual International Builders' Show. Since 1990, this national competition has given students the opportunity to apply skills learned in the classroom to a real construction company.

Students complete a management proposal for a specific project which includes: a site plan, product design, estimate, schedule, marketing and risk analysis, cash flow forecast and other essential elements. In the fall, the final proposals are submitted to a panel of judges who will review and grade the written proposals. Each team will present and defend their proposal to the judges in front of an audience during NAHB's annual International Builders' Show.
